Presidential March Madness

Each student will present a match-up between two presidents. They will then determine which president would win when comparing their presidencies. (Make sure to limit yourself to things that happened <u>DURING</u> the president's tenure in office: I'm looking at you Jimmy Carter).

The presentations should be between 5-10 mins long and meet the following criteria for **both** presidents:

- Context: Timeframe of years in office, political party, and overview of America during this time.
- Compare/Contrast each of these categories:
 - Foreign Affairs Ways this president got along with other countries.
 - Public Opinion How Americans reacted to this president (largely approve or disapprove?). Was the president unanimously supported by his party?
 - Political Reform Changes made by his president's administration that affected the country.
 - Social Changes Major changes to American society during the presidency. Were these
 changes because of the president or in spite of him? Assess whether they were good or
 bad for the country.

*Do more than just identify what something is/was. Explain the significance of that decision and how it affected the country.

<u>Make a final decision</u> on which president would win in a head-to-head competition. The class will then vote on whether they agree or disagree with you. 2/3 majority can overturn a decision.
